**A**S 2018 begins, I find myself reflecting fondly on the year past as 2017 marked Lake State's 25th year of operation and was definitely a year to celebrate and be proud of. We saw lots of ups and

downs and had unexpected challenges, learned valuable lessons and worked hard on ways to improve. We survived another year of Michigan's unpredictable weather from miserably hot to sub-zero temps and from beautiful sunny days to devastating floods. Through it all, we managed to see tremendous growth on the business development side with several new projects either underway or completed, with new customers and many existing customer expansions requiring more rail and/or transload services. To help prepare itself for the volume increases expected in 2018 and 2019, LSRC had a record year in Capital Improvements, expanded its train and engine forces, ramped up its customer service and dispatching departments, and upgraded to electronic tracking of employee safety training and certified records. We enhanced our safety training program, instituted a Safety & Health Committee and earned the Jake Award for Safety last year as well.

2017 also marked the inaugural year of LSRC's newsletter *The Turntable* allowing us to better connect with our customers and employees. In reflecting on all we have accomplished in the year past, not only on the business side but also within the company family itself, there are many reasons to be proud; LSRC now employs more people than ever and held the highest attended Christmas party in our history. As you can see from the pictures, some were winners and some.... well, made the fashion statement for the night. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves and it was a great way for our staff to connect with colleagues from different depart-



ments that we may not often see during the year.

Throughout 2017, we hosted a number of rail trips for business partners, customers, state officials and employee appreciation and team building as well. In early December, LSRC ran its first Santa Train benefitting Toys for Tots in Grayling, MI. Many LSRC customers, employees and their families volunteered their time and donated many boxes of toys for this great cause. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who participated and kindly gave. LSRC strives for a culture of giving back to our local communities and are proud of our employees and customers who have partnered with us and were generous in their donations to deserving charities like Toys for Tots and the CAN Council Great Lakes Bay region.

## Business Development



**L**AKE State Railway’s growth strategy continues to focus on working with our existing rail customers in finding ways to achieve a more competitive supply chain by incorporating rail, whether that is via economics, better transit times, increased car supply, or more frequent and reliable service. This strategy has paid off on the northern subdivisions of the LSRC network. In 2017, the Mackinac and Huron Subdivisions saw car-load growth of 25% from our existing customer base over 2016. Most of this growth is a result of increased modal market share for rail and from customer expansions.

In addition to the organic volume growth from our customer base, LSRC has seen overall volumes on the northern subdivisions grow by 135% in the last five years as a result of organic growth and economic development projects.

The coming year will bring several more exciting economic development projects up north. ARAUCO is expecting to begin production at the world’s largest particle board continuous press in Grayling by late 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2018. Coupled with the multiple other customer projects in the Grayling area, traffic on the Mackinac Subdivision is projected to double once more in the next two years.

In order to handle this growth and not lose track of providing service to our valued existing customer base, LSRC has expanded the number of T&E employees by nearly 20% in anticipation of the new traffic. The new business means additional scheduled jobs in Grayling, which we are now staffed to handle. Additionally, LSRC is working on establishing a new yard office and on duty location in Grayling to handle the employment increase.

I am proud of our team for working with our customers to understand their needs, and for achieving this growth through establishing new markets with our customers and not by simply shifting loads from other rail carriers. This is an exciting time to be on the Lake State team, watching our customers grow and seeing lower density subdivisions once again thrive with rail traffic.

## RIP TRACK REPORT

Lake State Railway has over 500 system cars owned or leased by LSRC. The Car Repair Department, based in Saginaw, MI handles the maintenance and upgrades to our railcar fleet. The Car Shop routinely performs work such as changing out wheel sets, installing new gates and hatches, or more involved tasks like structural work on end sheets or top chords. Maintaining this fleet is a continuous task, proactively making sure that we provide clean, reliable railcars for our customers. Part of the winter time routine is to cycle all of the 200+ aggregate cars through the Car Shop, making sure that they are in good mechanical condition, are current on air testing, equipped with proper safety appliances, and lubricating and testing the outlet gates. These routine inspections ensure that each spring and summer, LSRC is able to provide reliable equipment for our stone customers.



### FUN FACT:

R.I.P. Track is a railroad term that stands for Repair In Place. LSRC's R.I.P. track in Saginaw is a fully functional car shop. In 2017, LSRC's R.I.P. track performed repairs to over 1700 foreign railroad and private railcars, in addition to working on over 500 cars owned or leased by LSRC.

Freeland Bean & Grain recently opened a new retail store as well to serve the local community. After 34 years in business Freeland Bean & Grain still lives by their slogan "Serving You is Our Business".
